

Fire and Safeguarding Guidance for Adults Visiting or Working with Us

Fire Action

You should have been informed of any planned fire drills by reception when you arrived in the building. In the event of a fire alarm please follow the fire action below:

Fire assembly point maps are located by the door in each room

On hearing the fire alarm (continuous noise)...

- 1. Evacuate the room quickly and safely, ensure doors are shut and proceed to the nearest and safest fire exit as shown on the map
- 2. Leave all belongings behind
- 3. Make your way directly to the designated fire assembly point (Just beyond the benched area in the piazza)

If you discover a fire...

- 1. Raise the alarm by pressing the nearest 'Break Glass' alarm
- 2. Evacuate the building by the nearest and safest fire exit as shown on the map
- 3. Make your way directly to the designated fire assembly point (Just beyond the benched area in the piazza)

Accidents and First Aid

In an emergency situation, phone the medical room (ext: 2001) or reception (ext: 2000) on the nearest available telephone, giving details of the incident and location.

Keeping Children Safe

Everyone should play a part in keeping children safe whilst working on or visiting the school site. This is whether you are directly employed by the school, working as a contractor / sub-contractor or a volunteer.

Everyone working with our students should be aware that:

- Their role is to listen and note any observations which could indicate harm
- They should reassure the student
- All Safeguarding concern should be reported straight to a member of the Safeguarding team
- They should not investigate
- They should not promise confidentiality
- They should not ask leading questions
