

## Oliver Vincent Biography

British tenor Oliver Vincent has established himself internationally as a singer and performer of the highest calibre. As a young lyric tenor, his rich timbre and magnetic stage presence have led him to perform as a soloist, and as a Decca Classics Artist with the award winning vocal ensemble Voces8.



Oliver has featured on many radio and television broadcasts across the world, including BBC radio 3, BBC radio 3 in tune, Classic fm, MPR (Minnesota Public Radio), Radio France Musique, ARTE TV and Deutschlandradio Kultur. His beautiful voice and musicianship has led to critical acclaim for his other recent recordings with Voces8. 'Eventide' recorded and released on the Decca Classics label was awarded Classic fm's album of the year 2014 and entered the classical chart at number one. Gramophone praised the singing as "*impeccable in its quality of tone*". This was followed by the release of 'Lux', showcasing the versatility of Oliver's technical ability. The extremely popular track 'The Luckiest' underlines his comfort and ability performing in wide a range of styles. "*Versatile is certainly the word... But above all, it is the on-stage presence, character and connection with the audience*" The Telegraph.

Another large part of Oliver's busy schedule is education. Oliver is proud to be the musician-in-residence for Milton Abbey School. He has delivered masterclasses and taught singing technique, repertoire interpretation and performance practice domestically and internationally, in Japan, USA, Canada, Sweden, Germany, France, Belgium, and the UK.

Oliver is always looking to further his own professional development. He continues to study regularly with Justin Lavender.
